INTRODUCTION

The national election produced a historic result in which Donald J. Trump was elected President a second time by winning key battleground states such as Pennsylvania, Wisconsin, Michigan, Georgia, Arizona, Nevada, and North Carolina.

The election will significantly change the power balance of Congress, as Republicans have regained control of the US Senate with 53 Republican Senators following GOP flips in West Virginia, Ohio, Pennsylvania, and Montana. This Senate GOP margin will allow Republicans to control the agenda in the Senate as all the committee chairs and Senate leadership positions will be filled by Republicans.

The result in the US House of Representatives remains unsettled with many races too close to call. The final vote counting, which could last for days, will determine whether Republicans can achieve the trifecta of controlling the White House, Senate, and House. A unified Republican government would allow Congress to use a special expedited legislative process called “reconciliation” to advance high-priority budget and tax measures. Alternatively, the House could flip Democratic, although this seems less likely, allowing Democrats to operate as a check on Republican-driven policy and setting up key debates over government funding, tax policy, and the debt ceiling.

To help you assess the 2024 election, we have prepared a comprehensive guide that summarizes the results and their impact on the 119th Congress, which will convene in January 2025. The Election Guide lists all new members elected to Congress, updates the congressional delegations for each state, and provides a starting point for analyzing the coming changes to the House and Senate committees.

K&L Gates prepared this comprehensive guide to summarize how the 2024 national election will impact the new 119th Congress. It includes updated state congressional delegations and anticipated changes in House and Senate Committees. The guide will be updated periodically as the election results are finalized.

- All new Members of Congress are listed alphabetically by state along with links to their campaign websites, which contain biographical information. Outgoing Members of Congress are listed, with the reasons for their departures.
- Complete delegations for each state are included with new Members of the House and Senate highlighted in **yellow** to indicate no change in party and their predecessors shown. Seats that switched parties are highlighted in **red** for Republican pick-ups and **blue** for Democratic pick-ups. Races that are too close to call are highlighted in **gray**.
- Roster lists for each full Committee from the departing 118th Congress are included, with non-returning members lined out. The likely Chairs and Ranking Members for each Senate and House committee for the new 119th Congress are also noted.
